Final deadline for submissions: Noon on April 6th

This is your chance to present your creative skills to a wide audience.

Entrance into a juried show will help establish an exhibition record for your résumé. More than 15 awards and prizes worth over \$1,000 will be conferred by the Juror Julie Green (OSU Art Faculty), the LBCC Art Department, local businesses and community organizations. You must be a current LBCC student or have taken an art class in the last 2 years.

You may drop off work with your art instructor at any time before the deadline, or deliver to NSH 111. NOTE: The Gallery Office, NSH 111 will be open to receive submissions 4/4, 4/5, and 4/6 or by appointment. Note: this is a juried exhibit, not all work will be accepted.
